

Learn About the Gullah Geechee Culture

The McIntosh County Shouters sing and perform music that comes out of the **Gullah Geechee** culture and tradition. The people of this culture are direct descendants of Africans who were brought to the United States as slaves and lived in the Lowcountry, a region that includes South Carolina, Georgia, the Coastal Plain, and the Sea Islands. The Gullah community has preserved many of the cultural traditions of their African ancestors, including the ring shout, and their way of speaking, dancing, cooking, and dressing. They continue to pass on their traditions to their descendants and share their culture with the wider community.
